A Lifeline for A Lifetime

Sometimes an unexpected curve-ball, like a state-enforced stay-at-home order, results in job losses for community members. Oftentimes, these people are living paycheck-to-paycheck, and many of them have no "cushion" to fall back on. Such was the case when the COVID-19 pandemic reached Palm Beach County, putting many people in financial distress.

Meet Linda and Melissa.

Linda, a 78-year-old woman, lives with her 55-year-old daughter, Melissa, who is disabled with a rare neurological condition that makes her unable to stay in one position for long periods of time because of pain and weakness.

Linda's Social Security and small pension brings in about \$1,700 a month, with \$2,500 in monthly expenses. She and Melissa were able to make up the shortfall with around \$850 a month from a pet care business...until the pandemic, when the pair found themselves without any business and behind in bills. That's when they called the Chai Line, seeking financial assistance.

A Master's-level professional reached out to the pair, giving Linda and Melissa approximately \$300 in gift cards, food from the Alpert JFS Kosher Food Pantry, and encouraging them to apply for food stamps. The Chai Line specialist also shared information that would help Melissa be able to apply for Supplemental Security Income (SSI), as well as other available services that might be of financial help.

Thanks to the generous donations of our local community, Linda and Melissa were able to "stay the course," and avoid financial ruin and, in the process, get a more complete picture of the human services assistance available in South Florida.

Psychiatry & Child Psychiatry

Psychiatric services include developmental consultation and treatment, comprehensive assessment, medication evaluation and management, and ongoing monitoring. Our clinical team includes two psychiatrists: Dr. James Thompson, and Dr. Jeryl D. Kershner, a recognized expert in child and adolescent psychiatry. Our behavioral health specialists help individuals experiencing behavioral health challenges.

Holocaust Survivors Assistance

Seven dedicated professionals work to ease the lives of survivors of the *Shoah*, addressing their distinct social welfare, health care, and emotional needs. Guided by respect for their dignity, we provide assistance with the Reparations Benefits application process, care management, counseling, companionship, transportation, hot meals and socialization opportunities.

Peace of Mind for Seniors & Their Families!

A little planning and forethought go a long way in helping people age at home successfully. Among the things seniors and their families need to consider: accessibility, affordability, the need for in-home care, and the potential for isolation. Alpert JFS helps seniors continue living independently in their own homes for as long as possible, while maintaining their quality of life, with in-home and community-based services.

Meet Adele.

At the age of 97, Adele's health was declining. Once vivacious and active, she has a heart condition and recently succumbed to several falls, and received a breast cancer diagnosis. Her children, who all live out-of-state and were juggling families and careers, while trying to manage Adele's care long-distance, needed help.

As her son Karl said, "We were getting really concerned about Mom. My brother, sister and I knew that we needed to do something, but just weren't sure what that something was!" Alpert JFS was able to arrange for a professional care manager to do a comprehensive assessment of Adele while her family was visiting. Some of her immediate needs were met with a companion who came twice a week to help with grocery shopping, errands, and provide socialization.

The care manager accompanied Adele to her medical appointments to provide oversight and communicate with the family in real-time about her condition.

Because of our caring community, Adele's current needs are being met, and her care manager has created a plan, working with her and her family, that anticipates and addresses future needs and long-term planning.

Mental Health First Aid

This eight-hour course teaches a five-step strategy to help you identify, understand and respond to someone who is developing a mental health problem or experiencing a mental health crisis. We want to destigmatize mental illness and make mental health education as common as CPR training.

Support Groups

Licensed professionals facilitate a myriad of support groups, including dedicated gatherings for those experiencing grief and loss. Counseling Comforts a Child

Community members can be assured that, whatever else is going on in the world, they can rely on Alpert JFS Counseling and Psychiatry services. We are proud of our ability to provide ongoing support during COVID-19, particularly to our community's children who are facing challenges.

Meet David.

He is a 10-year-old boy on the Autism Spectrum, with sensory issues and ADHD, for which he is being medicated by his pediatrician. As a client of our Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist Dr. Jeryl Kershner, David had been having face-to-face visits following his evaluation. During COVID-19, the family was impacted by financial constraints, coupled with the negative impact of David's being housebound, away from his friends, and feeling lonely and isolated.


Thanks to the generosity of donors to Alpert JFS' COVID-19 Emergency Fund, David received financial support that enabled him to continue with much-needed Child Psychiatry services.
